



AGREEMENT ON ACADEMIC EXCHANGE  
BETWEEN  
FACULTY OF MEDICINE, GRADUATE SCHOOL OF MEDICINE, KAGAWA UNIVERSITY  
AND  
FACULTY OF MEDICINE AND GRADUATE SCHOOL OF MEDICINE, CHIANG MAI UNIVERSITY

According to the GENERAL MEMORANDUM FOR ACADEMIC COOPERATION AND EXCHANGE BETWEEN KAGAWA UNIVERSITY, JAPAN AND CHIANG MAI UNIVERSITY, THAILAND (concluded: April 24, 1990), Faculty of Medicine, Graduate School of Medicine, Kagawa University and Faculty of Medicine and Graduate School of Medicine, Chiang Mai University (hereafter referred to as the two universities) have decided to carry on a mutual exchange of faculty members and researchers as well as undergraduate and graduate students in observance of the following terms and conditions:

I. FACULTY MEMBERS AND RESEARCHERS

1. Regarding the travel expenses and other necessary costs incurred by a dispatched member of faculty or a researcher, or a faculty employee, the individuals will take the responsibility to pay. The two universities agree to support the faculty member or the researcher to find an appropriate accommodation.

II. STUDENTS

2. Each university may exchange no more than five students per year irrespective of undergraduate or graduate standing (hereafter referred to as students).
3. The specialized field of study for each exchange student must be in an academic area for which the host university is able to provide proper teaching staffs.
4. The students who may participate in this exchange program should be those who are recommended on the basis of their academic performance, behavior and motivation by the home university or the home graduate school.
5. The period of stay should last no more than one year.
6. Regarding the responsibility to pay tuition and other expenses, an agreement has been reached on the following terms:
  - (1) The host university will not levy an admission fee, and examination fee, or tuition from foreign exchange students.
  - (2) Travel expenses, room and board, expenses on books and personal injury insurance, etc., must be provided by the student concerned.
7. With respect to the accommodation facilities for exchange students during the period of their stay, the two universities will cooperate with the students by recommending an appropriate place in accordance with their requirements.
8. These "TERMS AND CONDITIONS" can be revised by mutual consent between the two universities.
9. These "TERMS AND CONDITIONS" are valid for five years from the day of conclusions of the agreement, and can be renewed every five years unless one side or both sides offer a proposal for repeal by letter, six months before the deadline of validity.
10. Although an exchange student is in non-degree status at the host university, the two universities are obliged to mail a transcript for the student concerned to the home university at the end of the exchange term. In the transcript, the number of credit units acquired by an exchange student and the grade given to the student will be shown. The result should be appreciated by the home university.

The terms and conditions are effective as on 29 July , 2011.
